Colorado Universal PreK - Update!

Yes - the cost of your 4 year old's tuition will go down



In a nutshell: Colorado UPK is 15 hours of free childcare for 4 year olds, starting in the 2022-2023 school year. You don't need to qualify - everyone gets it - but you do need to sign up at: UPK.Colorado.Gov

The state will confirm all "matches" in Round 1 on May 10th. You must accept or decline the match. If you don't accept, the spot goes to another family in Durango that is trying to get childcare for his/her four-year-old. (We have NO control over this!) Round 2 information is on the above website.

Children or families who qualify for CCCAP (Colorado's Child Care Assistance Program) or other funding sources (Head Start, for example) can stack UPK on top of those hours. Families can also privately pay for other hours. All combinations of payment will be allowed with participating providers. So, your child can go to childcare for 40 hours, and you can pay for 25 privately, and have 15 paid for. Riverhouse is a participating provider.

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Parent Survey Results



We received 38 out of 60 possible responses - a 63% return rate so far. The most salient information includes:

- 87% report they are very or mostly satisfied with Riverhouse
- 58% report they are "very satisfied" with their teachers, and another 34% are mostly satisfied.
- 38% would like to see cameras installed, and 46% are "maybes"
- 73% are happy with the number of activities we currently have
- 58% would like to see more personalized and cultural practices
- 62% (24 families so far) would like to see a bilingual program
- 36% report we need to improve transitions & 36% say they're great as is
- 40% would like to see more Parent's Night's Out offerings

We hear you and are making these plans based on the feedback we're receiving:

- 1. Hummingbirds we're adding Rie to the team to help with communication
- 2. Bilingual Program we are pursuing this; stay tuned in the fall!
- 3. 5 pm Pick-up this will begin as of Friday September 8th of this year
- 4. More consistent updates on what my child is learning we are following through with this to be sure parents get more information
- 5. Nap time we are shortening nap times and will follow through with this. Eagles has already been shortened, and will go away entirely this summer.

 Falcons & Blue Jays 2 hr maximum time on their cots. Nap times are 12:45 to 2:45.

 The other, younger classrooms, have a nap schedule according to the individual children's needs or as in Sparrows when the teachers deem it is needed.

Riverhouse Health & Wellness

With the warmer weather, sickness has definitely decreased, although many staff and children alike are struggling with allergies.

2) San Juan Basin Public Health advises everyone about the risk of <u>animal-borne</u> <u>diseases</u> such as rabies, plague (from fleas, chipmunks, squirrels, and prairie dogs), West Nile Virus from mosquito bites, Tularemia (a bacterium found in rodent and rabbit populations), and tick-bornes diseases (present like the flu and should be checked out for possible Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever).

Use insect repellent, vaccinate pets against Rabies, clean outdoor & dusty areas with masks and gloves, and do not mow over sick or dead animals.

Colorado Shines



The Colorado Shines Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS) is a tool for assessing, enhancing, and communicating the level of quality in early care and education. It rates all licensed early childhood programs in Colorado for quality using research-based standards. All licensed Child Care Programs that serve children prior to kindergarten participate in Colorado Shines. A SHINES visit happens once every 3 years and our visit happens this June.

All licensed programs automatically receive a Level 1 rating. Programs have the option to pursue higher ratings at Levels 2 – 5. Shines provides incentives and supports to encourage all early care and learning programs to make ongoing quality improvements. Quality levels 3, 4 and 5 are our goal. We are currently at a 3, which is considered good. We'd like to be at a 4. There are 5 categories that are focused on:

- 1. **Workforce & Professional Development** how qualified are our staff? How committed are we to ongoing professional development (very!) On June 2nd 18 teachers will be taking an all-day training in Conscious Discipline at Ft Lewis College. We regularly train in 1st Aid/CPR, Language Development, and with many more online courses in trauma, safety, and child development.
- 1. Family Partnerships this looks at our family activities (such as holiday events), Parent's Night Outs, a parent support group, working with families on such things as childrens' transitions to other classrooms, meeting special needs of children, and other family supports.
- **2.** Leadership, Management, & Administration staff development, workforce support, program operations, and commitment to continuous improvement.
- **3.** Learning Environment our curriculum, the classroom spaces, furnishings, program structure, activities, and teachers' interaction with the children.
- **4. Child Health -** how is our food program? Do we provide hearing, vision, and dental screenings? Do we promote both physical and mental health?

Facility Update

Saturday Parent's Night Outs

Once a month we offer "Parent's Night Out" two staff members sign-up to watch your child(ren) at a cost of \$25 for one child or \$40 for two children. Next PNO is Saturday, May 20th from 4 to 7:30 pm. Sign-up sheet is in the upstairs lobby entrance. It is capped at 10 children, so sign-up early.

Saturday was very popular last month - we filled up early.

The Lobby has free Loan items in it. Need to borrow a car seat? Clothing? Even diapers or formula? We have them in the lobby... please just see Chloe, Becky, or Angie to sign things out.

1 + 100 Women Who Care (About Riverhouse!)



In February we were awarded \$11,000 from this local all-female giving circle. Then, the Robert Schutz Family Foundation supplemented their contribution with a \$5,000 grant, so we ended up receiving \$16,000. When we applied for the money, we had to designate a need. Ours was health care benefits for staff. This money enabled us to sign up - in March - all of our staff who did not already have a primary care provider with a doctor through Durango Primary Care (Dr. Andy Owens). That is currently 10 staff members. We also have a contract that allows us to send over any new hires for the required wellness exam. The cost to Riverhouse is \$800 per month, or (x 10) \$8,000 for 2023. On May 1st we added dental benefits for 14 staff members at a cost of \$550 per month, or \$4,400 for the rest of 2023. That's a total of \$12,400. The remaining \$3,600 is currently set aside to help us pay for mental health services for any staff. They may go see our contracted Mental Health provider, Haley Wiedenman, for up to four sessions. All of these benefits are at zero cost to the employee. There is not even a co-pay with Direct Primary Care. This is a huge thank you to 100 Women Who Care! https://www.100womenwhocarelaplata.com/
